

Bloom Beyond: Fostering Success Tax Credit Disclosure

Bloom is a DFCS Qualified Foster Child Support Organization (QFCSO) working with other DFCS Qualified Foster Child Support Organizations, eligible aging out foster youth, as well as individual and business taxpayers to assist with the tax credit application process.

Thanks in part to the Fostering Success Tax Credit, Bloom provides comprehensive support to young adults (18-26) transitioning out of foster care through our Bloom Beyond program. Our personalized Navigator Services offers individualized guidance, system navigation, and holistic assistance with housing, education, career development, healthcare access, transportation, and life skills development. Young adults also receive essential needs support via the Bloom Closet including items such as clothing, shoes, personal care products, and school supplies. Bloom Beyond also has a Leadership Council, comprised of young people with lived experience in foster care, who help to ensure our programs remain relevant and impactful by providing valuable insights that shape our services. Council members receive professional leadership development and a monthly stipend for their participation.

The Fostering Success Act Tax Credit launched in 2023. In 2024, Bloom received an \$25,400 in contributions through the tax credit. All funds were fully expended in 2024 to support transition-age youth through our Bloom Beyond program, including direct services provided by program staff, housing support, educational assistance, mentorship, and essential items through The Bloom Closet.
