## Letter from our CEO



As I reflect on 2024, I am overwhelmed with gratitude as we celebrate a year of remarkable growth and transformation at Bloom. None of our progress would have been possible without the countless individuals—our devoted foster families, dedicated volunteers, and generous supporters—who each played a vital role in propelling our mission forward. Together, over the past two decades, we have grown from a small local nonprofit serving 25 children in Fayette County into a statewide agency reaching thousands of foster children across Georgia.

This year, we expanded our presence into northwest Georgia with the opening of our Rome office and launched new, innovative programs designed to meet the growing needs of children in foster care.

Here are just a few of the milestones that you helped us reach in 2024:

**Finding Forever Families:** Our foster care licensing team worked tirelessly to connect teens and children with therapeutic needs to loving foster families, ensuring they receive the care they deserve.

**Fostering Stability:** With 50-60% of the youth we serve facing high-risk trauma, our ability to maintain low disruption rates is critical. Bloom has maintained a 93% stability rate for the foster children we served this past year.

**Growing in Rome:** Our new Rome office is thriving, with eight newly licensed foster families in under a year—positioning Bloom to become one of the largest child-placing agencies in the region.

**Expanding Training and Resources:** Bloom University had a standout year, training foster families across multiple regions, and our Family Resource Center secured a grant to continue its vital work.

**Reaching More Children:** In 2024, Bloom launched two innovative programs to help reach more foster children and support young adults aging out of the foster care system. Bloom Direct will deliver clothing to the doorsteps of foster families across the state, while Bloom Beyond will provide foster young adults with critical support and resources to ensure a successful transition to independent living.

These achievements reflect the commitment of everyone who has been a part of our journey. Your time, generosity, and belief in our mission empower us to keep growing, innovating, and changing lives.

The pages that follow illustrate how Bloom is answering the call to support every foster child in Georgia. As we look to the future, I am confident that through collaboration, advocacy, and unwavering compassion, we will continue to work toward a world where every foster child has the stability, love, and resources they need to thrive.



# Transforming Lives Through Foster Care

HOW LITTLE MADDIE FOUND STABILITY, LOVE, AND HER FOREVER FAMILY

Every child deserves a safe, loving home and the support and resources necessary to reach their full potential. Maddie's story is a powerful example of how Bloom's dedicated foster families and a strong support system can transform a child's life.

Maddie came to Bloom as a medically fragile infant, facing more challenges in her first few months of life than most face in a lifetime. Born with complex medical needs, she required tube feeding and around-the-clock care. Her first Bloom foster family, the Smiths, went above and beyond to help meet her physical and emotional needs, even preparing specialized baby food and learning how to use her feeding pump.

In May of 2021, a licensed nurse named Allie began providing respite care for Maddie to support the Smith family. Allie became an integral part of Maddie's care team, stepping in regularly to provide support and working closely with the Smith family to ensure Maddie's needs were met. Allie's medical expertise allowed her to advocate for Maddie in ways that helped improve her quality of life.

"As a nurse, I felt comfortable challenging Maddie's medical team when necessary," said Allie. "Together, we were able to transition her to syringe bolus feeds, freeing her from being stationary for six-plus hours a day. The Smith family and I worked together in true partnership towards her progress."

When it became clear that the goal for Maddie had shifted to adoption, the Smith family approached Allie about becoming Maddie's full-time caregiver. On March 1, 2023, Maddie moved in with Allie for an extended respite and has been with her ever since!

According to Allie, the Bloom Closet was instrumental in supporting the journey for both she and Maddie. On her first visit, she picked out clothing, books, and a toy truck

that remains her favorite to this day. The shelves lined with books were especially meaningful, as Maddie, though non-verbal, adores reading.

Over the past several years, Maddie has made remarkable progress. She no longer requires daily medications and has started eating by mouth. Maddie played her first team sport this past year, tee ball—learning valuable lessons alongside her 3- and 4-year-old teammates. Perhaps most exciting, Maddie's adoption was finalized in December 2024, giving her a forever home.

"Maddie is fearless, and we've affectionately nicknamed her the 'tiny tornado,'" said Allie. "She's all dirt, dresses and dinosaurs, often outside barefoot in a tutu, roaring as she plays. She lives life ea-ger to experience everything the world has to offer."





# Expanding The Bloom Closet Programming

## BLOOM LAUNCHES NEW PROGRAM TO DELIVER HOPE AND CONFIDENCE STATEWIDE

Bloom is committed to ensuring every foster child in Georgia has access to the essentials they need to thrive. In 2024, a collection of monthly donors helped us take a significant step forward through the launch of Bloom Direct. This innovative program is designed to remove geographic barriers by providing children in emergency placements with clothing and essentials delivered directly to their doorstep.

Often, as children enter foster care, they arrive with little to nothing of their own. Bloom Direct ensures that within the first 48 hours of placement, children receive a box filled with clothing tailored to their size, style, and needs, bringing a sense of comfort and dignity during a time of great uncertainty.

In partnership with the Department of Family and Children Services (DFCS), Region 9, an area with limited resources, was identified as the pilot location for the Bloom Direct program. In its first phase, the goal is to distribute boxes to all 440 children living in that region. In year three, Bloom seeks to scale this program beyond Region 9 to reach 1,000 children annually.

“We’re dedicated to growing this initiative to reach as many foster children as possible,” said Bloom CEO Becky Davenport. “Bloom Direct is about more than clothing—it’s a message to each child that they are seen, valued, and supported.”

This past July, the first 25 boxes were sent to foster children in Region 9, marking the beginning of this ambitious effort. This milestone would not be possible without the generosity of Bloom’s recurring monthly donors, who provide the continued financial backing required to make this program successful.

“With Bloom Direct, we are breaking down barriers, creating new opportunities, and ensuring that every child, no matter where they are placed, has the essentials they need to step into their new home with dignity,” said Davenport. “Together, we are delivering hope one box at a time.”

## BLOOM DIRECT

- Over the past 15 years, The Bloom Closet has distributed more than \$13 million worth of clothing and daily essentials to foster children.
- Last year alone, Bloom served 7,800 foster children from 142 Georgia counties, providing \$2.28 million in free clothing and supplies.
- Since opening in 2010, The Bloom Closet has experienced a 20-30% annual growth rate in the number of children served, demonstrating the increasing demand for services.

- After receiving navigator support and guidance, transition-aged youth increase their knowledge of independent living skills and gain confidence when navigating things like healthcare, housing, or educational systems on their own.
- Having access to free clothing and essentials through the Bloom Closet eliminates a significant barrier to pursuing transition-aged youth's educational or career goals.



## Empowering Futures Through Bloom Beyond

### SUPPORTING FOSTER CARE YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS ON THEIR PATH TO INDEPENDENCE

As young adults transition into adulthood, the change can be overwhelming, and this is no different for foster youth. Without strong support systems, access to resources, or financial stability, foster children face even greater challenges in securing housing, education, and employment. Recognizing this critical gap, Bloom launched Bloom Beyond, a groundbreaking program designed to provide personalized support, essential resources, and leadership opportunities for young adults (ages 18-26) who are aging out of foster care in Georgia.

At the heart of Bloom Beyond is the Navigator Support Program, which offers hands-on, individualized guidance to help young adults navigate the complexities of independent living. This includes support for housing, education, career development, healthcare access, transportation, and critical life-skills training. By pairing young adults with dedicated Navigators, Bloom Beyond provides both tangible resources and emotional support to help build confidence and long-term stability.

An additional obstacle for this population of foster children lies within affording necessities. Utilizing resources from The Bloom Closet and Bloom Closet Express, Bloom Beyond provides free clothing and essential items, to help ease this financial strain while simultaneously fostering a sense of dignity and security.

A Leadership Council plays an integral role in ensuring that Bloom Beyond remains current, responsive, and impactful for this vulnerable population of emerging adults. Similar to a board of directors, the Leadership Council consists of young adults with lived experience who help shape the daily and future goals of the program. While helping to guide the development of this program, this opportunity provides a unique experience for the Council's constituents to gain professional leadership experience and earn a stipend to support their journey as they launch into their career. This Council represents Bloom's commitment to incorporating youth voice and lived experience into its program development.

"With the expansion of Bloom Beyond, we are creating a comprehensive support system that empowers young adults to thrive," said Michaela Guthrie, Bloom Beyond Program Director. "Through strategic partnerships, innovative funding opportunities like the Fostering Success Tax Credit, and continued community engagement, we are committed to helping young adults turn their goals into reality."

After spending nine years in foster care and aging out at 19, Bloom Beyond's Program Director, Michaela Guthrie, brings both lived experience and professional expertise to Bloom. She holds both a master's and a bachelor's degree in social work from the University of Alabama and has launched child placing agencies and family resource centers at various Atlanta nonprofits. As a licensed clinical social worker, her personal journey drives her commitment to creating better outcomes for others impacted by the system. She looks forward to building partnerships and applying her unique perspective to make a meaningful difference at Bloom.

BLOOM EXPANDS FOSTER CARE SUPPORT TO NORTHWEST GEORGIA

## ROME, GA

153 | Children served monthly

- The Foster Care program in Rome is thriving, with eight newly licensed foster families in under a year—positioning Bloom to become one of the largest child-placing agencies in the region.
- Since opening in May of 2024, the Bloom Closet in Rome has served over 675 children, with an estimated 17,876 items distributed, totaling \$129,072.
- The goal for this new location was to serve 100 children a month by June of 2025, but that goal was reached shortly after opening, with 153 children served in July of 2024.

In May 2024, Bloom expanded its footprint to northern Georgia by opening a second location in Rome to meet the growing demand for foster care services. This new facility eliminates geographic barriers, allowing Bloom to provide local support and resources to families who previously endured long travel days, while also significantly extending our impact.

This new location serves as a fully operational resource center, offering foster families the same services and essentials available at Bloom’s flagship location in Fayetteville. From clothing and supplies to training and community support, Bloom is committed to ensuring that every foster child has the resources they need, no matter where they are located.

“The opening of our Rome facility marks a significant milestone in our mission to provide localized support for foster children,” said Becky Davenport, CEO of Bloom. “Our goal is to keep children in their communities where they can thrive and heal surrounded by familiar environments.”

Looking ahead, this new location is just the beginning. Bloom remains dedicated to expanding its services, reaching more foster children, and ensuring that every child in Georgia finds the stability, love, and support they deserve.
